
## **Cause and Effect of the Industrial Revolution**

#### **Industrial Revolution Timeline**

<u>1721</u>: Cromford Mill was the first factory with the first water powered cotton spinning mill.

<u>1760</u>: Industrial Revolution begins in England

<u>1733:</u> Flying Shuttle made weaving faster, invented by John Kay.

<u>1769:</u> Water Frame, improved the Spinning Jenny, ran on water instead of human labor.

<u>1767:</u> Spinning Jenny, a machine that can spin thread more quickly was invented James Hargreaves.

<u>1784:</u> Steam Powered Loom that turned thread into cloth is invented by Edmund Cartwright.

<u>1783:</u> Henry Cort patented the puddling process which allowed wrought iron to be produced in large quantities.

<u>1792-3:</u> Eli Whitney invents the cotton gin, changing the textile sector. Now cotton fiber was separated from seeds through machine.

<u>1831</u>: Electric Generator led to improvements to create the first generator to support a factory. Invented by Michael Faraday.

1837: Telegraph made transmission of messages easier. Invented by William Fothergill & Charles Wheatstone.

<u>1856</u>: Bessemer Converter was the first process of manufacturing steel that wasn't expensive.
